DISCLOSURE OF COMMISSION ACTIONS TO THE PUBLIC

According to *Section X (D)(3), Rules of Process and Procedure, Standards of Accreditation*, the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (“ACCSC” or “the Commission”), at the same time it notifies the school, will make public an action subject to appeal, with the exception of the denial of a substantive change application. As prescribed in the *Rules of Process and Procedure*, this summary of the reasons for the Commission’s action is being made public along with information pertaining to the ACCSC appeal process.

At its November 2009 meeting, ACCSC voted to revoke the accreditation of MCed Career College (“MCed”) located in Fresno, California and to remove the school from the ACCSC list of accredited institutions. Summarized below are the accrediting standards that are the subject of this revocation action.

Summary of Grounds for the Revocation of Accreditation

1. MCed failed to demonstrate the successful student achievement of its students by showing that a high portion of its students obtained employment in the field for which they were trained (*Section VII, Statement of Purpose, Standards of Accreditation*).
2. MCed failed to demonstrate that it has appropriate management, administrative capacity, and infrastructure to support the delivery of its distance education program and fulfill obligations to students (*Section I, Statement of Purpose, Standards of Accreditation*).

ACCSC Appeal Process

MCed has elected to appeal the Commission’s decision to revoke the school’s accreditation and to remove the school from the ACCSC list of accredited institutions. According to *Section VIII (B)(1), Rules of Process and Procedure, Standards of Accreditation*, “a school affected by an adverse accreditation action taken by the Commission may appeal that decision if it has reason to believe the Commission’s decision was arbitrary, capricious, or otherwise in substantial disregard of the criteria or procedures of the Commission, or not supported by substantial evidence in the record on which the Commission took action.”

Accordingly, MCed remains accredited, operating under a Probation Order, until the final disposition of the appeal (*Section VIII (A)(2), Rules of Process and Procedure, Standards of Accreditation*).
