SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES – LEVEL II

The Commission considers the following to be Level II Substantive Changes (Requires Commission level approval) to an educational institution (*Section IV (C) (2) (b), Rules of Process and Procedure, Standards of Accreditation*):

- a. A change of mission or educational objectives;
- b. A change of control (with the exception of a transfer of ownership interest within an immediate family);
- c. A relocation (a change of location greater than 25 miles);
- d. The term “University” in the school’s name;
- e. An addition of a new degree program that represents a change in academic level at the institution – non-degree to degree, occupational to academic, or a higher credential;
- f. An Application for a Master’s Degree;
- g. An addition of a branch campus; and
- h. An Institutional Teach-Out Agreement that establishes a permanent separate facility.
