I am honored to express my continued interest in serving within the sphere of higher education, particularly through meaningful engagement with the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC). Since entering the field in 2003 as a faculty member at Full Sail University, I have remained steadfast in my commitment to educational quality, student success, and institutional integrity.

My relationship with ACCSC began in 2011, following a presentation at the Professional Development Conference in Long Beach. I was invited to become a Team Leader, which marked the beginning of a purposeful and enduring involvement with the Commission. In 2014, I was elected as an ACCSC School Commissioner and served on the Board through 2018, including on the Executive Committee from 2017 to 2018. I believe this dual perspective equips me to make a substantive contribution to the Nominating Committee, a body that plays a pivotal role in ensuring the integrity, effectiveness, and forward-looking composition of the ACCSC Commission.

It would be a privilege to continue supporting the Commission's mission through thoughtful governance and strategic stewardship. I remain deeply committed to upholding the values of quality, accountability, and service that define ACCSC's work.
